Since 1956, North Shore Senior Center (NSSC) has partnered with older adults and their families to help them access valuable community resources. Whether you are concerned about maintaining your independence in your own home, need help filing your income taxes, or want to learn how to cut through Medicare-related red tape, our trained professional staff can assist you.

Our Programs and Services

Our goal is to give older adults the assistance they need to live safely and comfortably in their own homes so they can “age in place” and avoid premature, long-term nursing home placement. We achieve this goal through our many in-home and community-based programs and services.

Adult Protective Services (APS): The State of Illinois has designated North Shore Senior Center as the local agency to investigate reports of abuse, neglect and financial exploitation of older adults and people with disabilities, ages 18-59. Call us at 847.784.6040 or call the APS Hotline at 866.800.1409. All reports are handled with strict confidentiality.

Benefits Counseling & Medicare (SHIP): Trained NSSC volunteers help older adults with issues related to Medicare, hospital/physician bills, and choosing supplemental managed care or long-term care. Individuals are screened for their eligibility for 20 different programs that may provide money or services.

Caregiver Resources: This program includes respite, caregiver support groups and workshops, supportive counseling, education programs and an annual caregiver celebration.

Choices for Care: Designed to ensure that individuals who are planning to enter a nursing home actually need that level of care, this program also explores alternative community resources and options so an informed decision can be made.

Chore Housekeeping: This program can help provide a trained housekeeper to assist older adults by doing light housekeeping several hours each month. An assessment is required to determine eligibility.

Community Care Program (CCP): Administered through the Illinois Department on Aging, this program provides eligible older adults with a trained homemaker to assist with personal care and household tasks. CCP also may provide various supervised recreational/social activities. An Emergency Home Response System is available to those who qualify.

Escorted Transportation Service (ETS): NSSC volunteers transport clients to and from medical and dental appointments within our service area. For more information or to request a transport, please call 847.784.6053. There is a fee for this service.

Friendly Visiting Program: This outreach effort allows for NSSC volunteers and homebound older adults to socialize on a weekly basis and forge lasting friendships.

General Case Management: This program requires an assessment to determine an individual's needs before a plan of care can be implemented. Common issues involve applying for benefits, help in the home, home-delivered meals or access to medical care and affordable housing.

Grandparents Raising Grandchildren: This program provides emotional support, parenting education, respite and financial counseling, and assistance for older adults who are raising young children.

Hearing Loss Program: NSSC offers a weekly support group and monthly meetings of the Hearing Loss Association of America (HLAA).

Home-Delivered Meals: This program ensures that isolated older adults can enjoy healthy, nutritious food in their homes. NSSC provides assessments to determine need, makes referrals to meal providers, and monitors the program's effectiveness.

Lending Closet: Individuals can borrow durable medical goods such as walkers, canes and wheelchairs. This is a free service, and there are no membership, residency, age or income requirements.

Options Counseling: Trained professionals provide a personal long-term care plan and connections to vital resources catered to each unique situation. Available to older adults, caregivers and adults with disabilities.

Support Groups: NSSC offers a variety of support groups for issues including hearing loss, low vision, memory loss, Parkinson's disease and caregiving.

Wellness Education: NSSC provides a variety of ongoing health and wellness education programs at local senior housing buildings. Topics include arthritis, nutrition, exercise, asthma and osteoporosis.
